Message to the Community

Dear Friends, Community Partners, and Colleagues,

On behalf of the Board of Directors, we are pleased to share the 2021-2022 Annual Report for the San Diego Regional Center (SDRC).



Reflecting on the past year, we are struck by the contrast between our extraordinary accomplishments and the extraordinary difficulties still lingering from the pandemic. The dedication, character, and collaboration among the staff, our board of directors, service providers, and community partners are what continue to move us forward through these challenging times.

SDRC has experienced significant growth in the number of individuals we support this past year, from serving close to 33,000 clients at the beginning of the year to over 37,000 today in San Diego and Imperial counties.

We have several new initiatives we implemented this year in partnership with the Department of Developmental Services (DDS). They include:

- The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Part C Project is a pilot project to increase Early Start enrollment for children from communities with low participation rates.
- The Language Access & Cultural Competency (LACC) initiative will facilitate consistent access to information and services for multi-lingual, monolingual, and diverse cultural groups.
- Enhanced Service Coordination is a reduced caseload service (1-40) intended to improve service access and delivery for clients in underserved communities with low or no service purchase, including non-English speaking and the hearing impaired.
- Early Start outreach for Tribal Communities is an initiative where we are taking the lead to raise awareness and knowledge of Early Start services.
- Social Recreation programs have been restored and expanded. Funding will also support non-medical therapies, specialized recreation, art, dance, and music.

We are continually inspired by the people we serve, our community, and the commitment behind the SDRC team. We have much work ahead of us in 2023, exciting opportunities, and, no doubt, obstacles we will face with ingenuity and the forward-thinking we have relied on this past year.

Message from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

November 1st marked my first anniversary as Executive Director at the San Diego Regional Center. As we emerge from the aftermath of the pandemic and transition from crisis management to addressing more specific needs of our community and the people we serve, SDRC is making great strides. We are returning to our strategic priorities and can more carefully identify the areas of greatest need and greatest opportunity.

SDRC is excited to partner with the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) on several new initiatives to strengthen our landscape of services to our community. To generate successful outcomes from these initiatives, we will build on our existing partnerships and continue to establish new ones that can bring additional tools to those we support.

We are expanding our outreach efforts to historically underserved populations like the Tribal and Chaldean communities and homeless families. We are also opening doors to undocumented families whose children would benefit from California Early Start services.

Some of our existing programs, including day programs, look-a-like day programs, and our independent living program, have also expanded to include remote services for those clients and families who prefer remote options. Social recreation and camp services have returned and now cover additional non-medical therapies like music, art, and horseback riding.

I continue to work with the Association of Regional Center Agencies (ARCA) and our legislators to advocate for our community partners and staff. Provider rates and caseload ratio reductions are a priority.

These are just a few of the critical areas we are addressing to support the individuals that have long looked to the regional center for help.

With the unwavering support from the Board of Directors, SDRC staff, our forward-thinking service providers, and clients and their families, the possibilities are endless.

I am excited to continue on this journey in 2023, working with an incredible team to provide the exceptional services we have been providing to our community for the past 53 years.





Purchase of Services Expenditures FY 2021-2022









Age of Clients






Diagnosis of Clients







Ethnicity of Clients




